Facilities Update - May 2022

Irrigation system/Grass areas:

We are identifying lawn areas that can be converted to wood chips to reduce watering. Our gardeners have said Calabasas residents must cut water consumption by 50%. If the drought continues it's only a matter of time before Los Angeles will see something similar.

As of mid-April, when this was written, Rohan's Eagle Scout project is about 90% complete. The only remaining issue to complete the project to replace the parkway grass with gravel is to bend over some of the exposed weed matt. We hope that will be done soon!

We are trying to trap some of the pesky gophers in the grass areas near the sign at the front of the property and on the west side of the access road. The gophers avoided our first attempt. It will be a process!

Fountains:

The Maynard/Sherman Way Fountain will be on a new schedule of 9am to 1pm daily.

Fellowship Hall Kitchen:

We were inspected by the Fire Department and were cited for an out of date Fire Suppression System over the Kitchen Stove/Oven. Our current system is a dry product and the new systems use a liquid. The repair is being contemplated but we have an anonymous member who will cover the cost of about \$7-8,000. We are blessed!

Roofs:

We have accepted our roofer's quote for repairing the roof section from the sanctuary kitchen to the Library. The quote was for about \$7,000. This will be paid for by the Capital Fund. Thank you and blessings to anyone who has given a designated gift for the Capital Fund. It's the only way for us to pay for these larger repair and maintenance issues that are not in the budget! New contributions are always welcome. Just note Capital Fund on your check!

Parsonage:

In the next 60 days we will begin the renovation of both the inside and outside of the Parsonage for Pastor Elaine Shin-Paull and family just as we did for the Westover's before they arrived. The outside landscaping will include drip irrigation and quite a few Lantanas because they are water tolerant and flower much of the year. For the inside we are focusing on the basics 1) carpet cleaning 2) paint 3) plumbing fixture replacements 4) oven replacement 5) window covering replacements. There is quite a bit more to think about but we'll have to prioritize projects based on the money available. Again, these repairs will be paid for through the Capital Fund.
