
Reading Program:



One more from the pastor's desk...

"It was he who gave some to be evangelists, and some to be pastors, and teachers, to prepare God's people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ...."

Ephesians 4:11-13(NIV)

During my last time-off, I asked the Lord for His guidance in prayers. God kept putting an impression on my heart saying, "Feed my sheep, feed my sheep...". With this charge from God, I wish to "feed" you with His holy Word during our time together.

At my first leadership meeting here, I've shared three things from Ephesians 4:1-16.

Church is called to be spiritual. When we lose that quality, we will be lost.

We are called to reconcile the entire human race to God. We are the mediator to restore the relationship between God and His people.

Church's ministry is not about 'me' but God.

There are some steps that we can take to deepen our walk to be more spiritual in the Lord.

- a. Talk to God: How about having a real heart to heart conversation with God? Tap into your inner core and share your deepest concerns, fears and thanks. Also, remember to watch for God's answers.
- b. Count your blessings: Name the things that you are thankful for. These days we take so much for granted. We have been given so many gifts that we become desensitized to the fact that they are gifts and can be taken away. Reconnect all the wondrous gifts you've received in your life back to their ultimate Giver.
- c. Learn the Bible: The Bible is the blueprint of creation, God's instruction manual and His love

letter to us. Learn it and deepen your understanding of how He thinks, and His ways.

- d. Trust in God: The people you most love are the people you most trust. And vice versa. Think about something that concerns you, that is creating some fear financial pressures, results from a medical test, the boy your daughter is dating and let go of the fear and trust God for things over which we have no control. Trust that God has you in His hands. He is aware of your difficulty. He has the power to help and He wants to help. *"God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose."* Rom. 8:28
- e. Do Good: When we put our faith into action, God shows up. Doing good is a proactive way of living to stay in love with God. Don't wait until your life circumstances enable you, but find ways to do good, in small and big ways that are possible. 3 John 11 b says, *"Whoever does good is from God."*

With this I want to ask you the famous question that John Wesley asked: "How is it with your soul?" *How is it with our soul? Rev. Elaine Shin-Paull*

Financial Update

Things are looking up! We are now working with two new congregations, and it looks as if one will sign a lease in early August. One is looking to use the Fellowship Hall Gym and Lounge on Friday/Tuesday nights, and the other congregation expects to use the same space on Saturday/Wednesday nights. We remain hopeful that additional user groups will ease the financial pressure of keeping up the facilities. The Giant Green Crane

You may have seen this new "resident" of our parking lot and Maynard Street. The enormous crane is here for a couple of weeks updating the T-Mobile network which is served from the tower on the East side of the church property.

The enclosed space where the tower is located is rented to T-Mobile for a very considerable monthly rent, \$2,420. They also pay the church \$400 each month for power usage. That has proven to be a reliable source of income for many years.

Facilities Update

Landscaping: Water reduction projects – The project to cover the lawn area outside the Education Building rooms 7-8 with wood chips should be complete by the end of July. We also have two other areas covered by gravel that have been completed as part of Eagle Scout Projects. At the Parsonage, we will be placing wood chips in the dirt area between the curb and sidewalk. We're making progress reducing our water consumption!

Parsonage: The Parsonage rehab was completed in early July just before Pastor Elaine and family moved in. The updates included inside painting, flooring, new lighting, some updates to the bathrooms, carpet stretching and carpet cleaning. Special thanks to Karen Grengs for overseeing this project!

Pastor's Office: We also completed updates to the Pastor's office which included new overhead light lenses to improve the lighting, painting the bookcase and walls, and cleaning the carpets. Thanks to Ken Dimmick for installing the new light lenses!

Fellowship Hall Upstairs Women's Bathroom: In mid-July Grace Alcalde, who does our janitorial work, discovered a large leak in the upstairs women's bathroom. Since the bathroom wasn't used often, the leak continued for many days until discovered. We have dried it out and will work to replace the flooring. Our thought for the future is to make it into a storage closet. As a result, we will be turning the one remaining upstairs bathroom into a Unisex bathroom.

Spider web removal: Our thanks to Dean White and Victor Avalos, leaders of Boy Scout & Cub Scout Troops 747, for cleaning the east side of Fellowship Hall of spider webs and for cleaning the patio area with power equipment. We appreciate their hard work.
