Heart to Heart: A Gentle Reminder

Church family,

I want to share a gentle clarification, and I'm thankful for the respectful and caring spirit you bring to our church.

In the United Methodist Church, when it comes to weddings, funerals, memorial services, and other sacred family events, there is a clear protocol that protects both the congregation and the clergy. Once a pastor has moved to a new appointment or has retired, it is the responsibility and privilege of the current appointed pastor to provide pastoral care and to officiate.

Retired clergy or former pastors are not to preside or participate in services at our church unless they have first been invited by the current pastor. Our Bishop also sent a reminder about this protocol to both active and retired clergy on October 27, 2025.

This is not simply about rules. It is about trust, healthy leadership, and avoiding confusion or divided loyalties. When we honor this boundary, we strengthen the care of the people who are here now, and we reassure the congregation that they are being cared for well in the present.

So here is the simple practice moving forward: if a retired pastor, former pastor, or any visiting clergy is contacted about doing a service or participating in worship at First Church, please direct the request to me before any plans are made. And to my clergy colleagues who remain connected to families here, thank you for your gracious care. The best next step is always to defer to the current pastor and allow me to extend an invitation if appropriate.

Thank you for helping us keep our worship life clear, peaceful, and centered. I'm grateful to serve as your pastor.

Laura Longman Memorial Scholarship Ministry

2026 Season is in Process


This February is filled with anniversaries and memories for the friends and family of the Laura Longman Memorial Scholarship. It was 47 years ago this month that Laura, age 20, drove herself to St Joseph's Hospital in Burbank because she was having difficulty breathing. She had had the flu since before Christmas of 1978. She was admitted and diagnosed with cardiomyopathy. Later that year she received an experimental heart transplant at Stanford University Medical Center. It was like "putting a new engine in a very tired old car."

She returned to a very active life with her new heart. Since her childhood she had loved to be learning. She entered San Francisco State University as a junior studying Biochemistry. On February 9th of 1984, Laura sent valentine cards to her friends and family. None of those cards had return addresses on them. She knew that her heart was failing. Laura, then a senior, died in class of heart failure on February 10th, 1984.

The Laura Longman Memorial Scholarship was founded as a living memorial to Laura and to help other students finish their bachelor's degree. On Easter Sunday, 1985 the first scholarship grants were awarded. By April 2025 \$212,500 had been awarded in 127 scholarship grants given to 98 different students. Applications for the 2026 season were distributed in December 2025 and January 2026. Applicants will return their completed applications by February 19, 2026. After the review process recipients will be chosen and presented with their Scholarship awards on Palm Sunday, March 29, 2026.

Since the inception of the Laura Longman Memorial Scholarship, families have chosen to



make contributions in memory of their loved one or in honor of someone. This month we are encouraging interested people to contribute in support of the 2026 recipients, yet to be chosen. All donations are dedicated to fund scholarship grants.

Anyone who would like to contribute to this ministry in memory or honor of a loved one is invited to write a check payable to the First United Methodist Church of Canoga Park with the memo line reading "Laura Longman Memorial Scholarship." Please include a note of dedication to your loved one or honoree. All donations and gifts are dedicated for use in this ministry. We've decided to wait until sometime in the future when the monitors are taken down for repair or replacement to address the termites. There isn't enough room immediately behind the monitors to properly do the heat treatment we were considering.

The one year anniversary of the fires in LA, in the Pacific Palisades and in Altadena reminds us of all our conference, our world, and our community was changed by those fires.

And we want you to know that we haven't forgotten those who lost homes, those who lost loved ones, those who lost churches, and neighborhoods and towns. We haven't forgotten you.

And as the church, we are here to be with you into the future and to continue to walk alongside of you as you find new ways to live your life, even in new communities. Our prayers are with you, our support is for you. And we as a conference are continuing to walk alongside all of those who suffered the most.

So especially in the coming days, I pray that you would lift up, in whatever community you're in, lift up the community Church of Pacific Palisades, United Methodist Church that burned and also Altadena United Methodist Church, the church that burned as well. And all the people associated with them, and all those who lost their homes. Lift them up in prayer.

And if you know someone who lost something during that fire, reach out to them and let them know you remember this date. God is with us. And sometimes that's the best we can hope for. Just that God is with us. I'm praying for you.

As of December 2025, Cal-Pac received nearly 1.5 million dollars in donations from around the world, including \$85,000 in gift cards. Now, in addition to on the ground support, UMCOR has awarded a grant of \$624,000 to Cal-Pac for ongoing recovery in our area.
