Heart to Heart

At the Bishop's Convocation in August, guest speaker Rev. Dr. Kirk Jones shared three profound insights to nourish our souls, addressing all the clergy present. Rev. Jones discussed how our society valorizes "busyness" and views "productivity" as the yardstick for success. To be truly effective and fully present in our moments, he encouraged us to embrace three principles:

- 1. **Be Still** God's message is clear: "Be still and know that I am God..." Even Jesus himself understood the value of stillness. He took time to rest, retreat from the crowds, enjoy solitude, and engage in meaningful conversations, such as his dialogue with the Samaritan woman by the well. We must learn to cultivate stillness, for it enables us to be fully present with others.
- 2. Awareness Being aware of our own energy is crucial to live our lives fully awake. How attuned are you to your energy? Jesus, amidst a throng of people, recognized the energy shift when a woman touched his garment (Matthew 9:20). He was aware of his energy, and so should we be.
- 3. **Playfulness** Jesus, too, had a playful spirit. He employed mud to heal a blind man and, upon seeing the inviting Galilee Sea, decided to walk on its waters. Playfulness is a cornerstone of our well-being. By enjoying moments of joy with family and friends, we find peace, which in turn fosters clarity and creativity.

In the hustle and bustle of our lives, it's vital that we take the time to breathe and nourish our souls. I trust that these insights, as much as they've enriched me, will be a source of nourishment for you as well. May you find peace in stillness, awareness, and playfulness.

Over the past 60 years, we have experienced vast changes in how women live their lives and choose to engage the world in faith as well as great changes in the life of the church.

It is time to adopt a name that reflects how women are living and engaging their faith in today's realities.

Our new name is part of an overall move to refresh our organization that includes a new look, new feel and new and improved programs. We will be able to better nurture our current members while welcoming into our sisterhood new women who want to put their love into action. The new operating name is also welcoming to women whose local churches may choose to align with another denomination or who are already members of other denominations.

Are we still a part of the United Methodist Church?

Yes! We are still the only official women's organization of The United Methodist Church and our corporate name will remain United Methodist Women.

Financial Update

Appeal: As of mid-August, we are making progress against our fundraising goal of \$50,000 to replace the reserve funds used during Covid and enable us to re-pipe the gas lines to the sanctuary. The gas re-pipe is scheduled for September 18th at which time the Appeal will end. For all of you who have contributed – we thank you! For anyone who has been out of town or hasn't got around to it, we prayerfully ask for your participation. We'll announce the totals raised on Sunday, September 17th.

Facilities Update

We continue to experience one-time expenses beyond our budget. As we began preparing the Education Buildings for new user groups, we discovered the yard area and back buildings have a serious flea infestation which has been an issue in the past. The quotes to address the fleas, bugs, and animal removal/securing all openings under the Yellow House have been an eye opener. The two we have received to date are for \$2000 & \$3600. We will continue to quote the problem and hope to find something in the \$1500 range but at this point that's just a hope.

We have submitted a request for credit from the LADWP regarding the two major water leaks we have recently experienced. Hopefully, we get some good news on this front!

What Is An AED

The AED can help save a life when caring for a non-breathing child aged 8 or older who weighs more than 55 pounds, or for an adult during cardiac arrest.

If no one with experience using the AED is available, calling 911 is always best.

Our church facilities have 4 Automated External Defibrillators;

1 in the Sanctuary hallway and 1 in the Fellowship Hallway The key to open these AED's is attached on the bottom of the unit in a magnetic box.

The other 2 AED's are in Room # 2 of the Education Building. The key for these is in a cupboard above the sink in Room # 2. Written instructions are also posted on the nearby bulletin boards and in the Room # 2 cupboard.

"The Chosen"



A Bible study looking at the new media sensation, "The Chosen" Season II will be conducted after Worship Services each Sunday beginning September 24 and running for eight weeks to November 12, 2023. The theme of Season II, entitled "Blessed are the Chosen", is the Sermon on the Mount. Sessions will be lead by Roger Johnson and include a short study

guide each week with Scripture references and some discussion questions for preparation. Each meeting will run for about 90 minutes and include some introductory remarks, the video presentation, and subsequent discussion.

"The Chosen" is a wonderful way to capture the heart, the emotions, and the essence of the characters in the Scriptures. One of the purposes of "The Chosen" is to create characters with personality and depth of life so that you can read the Scriptures and understand why biblical characters may have behaved in the way that they did. Each episode of "The Chosen" is a story which contains Scriptures and provides us with a possibility of how things may have taken place in Jesus' time. They dramatize and bring life and depth to the Scriptures. We expect that the drama, containing Scripture, will leave us strengthened and encouraged in our faith.

The purpose of our study is to help us understand how the Scriptures are woven into each story so that we can learn from the lives of the characters and the teachings of Scripture. We will prepare for each episode with a summary of the main characters, a summary of the content of each episode, and the applicable Scriptures. Being prepared in that way, we hope to glean a greater understanding of what is actually happening as we watch. The questions will not require a 'scholarly background' but they are intended to stimulate our understanding, discussion and help us in the application of the Scripture lessons in our lives today.

All are welcome to join us. We encourage you to register to attend so that we can e-mail preparation material to you during the week before each meeting and so that we have a room to fit our class size. Please register by adding your name and email address to the signup sheet on the bulletin board in the parlor.
