Benjamin Villareal was awarded the Laura Longman Memorial Scholarship on Easter Sunday.



Remembering Noel Roberson



A memorial service for Noel Roberson was held at church on Thursday, April 4, followed by a luncheon at the Hidden Lake Clubhouse.

Noel passed away peacefully with family by his side on March 4, 2024, at the age of 83.

He was born in Longview, Texas, and spent his school years in Lubbock. It was during high school that Noel met the love of his life, Nanette Nelson, whom he married in 1962. The union was blessed with two daughters, Gina and Shayna.

With a Bachelor of Business Administration from Texas Tech University, Noel took a sales position with Thomas J. Lipton, where he would remain employed for 27 years. Lipton would afford the Robersons the opportunity to move to California in 1968.

The family lived in Encino and then Torrance before making their forever home in West Hills. Over the next twenty years Noel would enjoy hobbies such as photography, antique collecting, and home improvements. Memorable family outings included trips to Hawaii, New York, attendance at the 1984 Olympic Games and annual water-skiing trips to Lake Havasu, Arizona.

After retirement in 1992 from the Lipton/Lawry's food franchise, Noel and Nanette crossed the pond to admire European artifacts, traveled to China, partied it up in Jamaica and even enjoyed a hot air balloon flight as they drifted over the Giza plateau.

In the end it was cancer that swept Noel from the earth to the heavens, where we know he will rest peacefully until we meet again.

Remembering Mervin Hewitt



Mervin's life story began in harmony in the pleasant parish hills bordering Saint Andrew and Kingston on the western end of Jamaica. Nothing could have prepared her for losing both parents in her youth. After such

significant changes in her family life by the age of 14, she was lovingly raised by her grandparents, Leonora and Josiah Collins. Mamie Leah, as Leonora was known, taught her the resilience and determination that came to define her. With her siblings, Jethro, Gilbert, Amy, Carrol, and Jasmine, she navigated life's journey.

Her education at Windsor High School in Kingston led her to a fulfilling career as a licensed practical nurse. Her gentle hands cared for many at Issac Barrant Hospital and Princess Margaret Hospital. Mervin also brought her caring spirit to the National Children's Home in Jamaica, where she served as a House Mother, a role that showcased her natural nurturing qualities before she retired.

Mervin's legacy is vast, with 6 children, 24 grandchildren, 31 great-grandchildren, and numerous great-great-grandchildren. Her heart was filled with love, shared with Herbert Murphy and later, Herman Hewitt, who preceded her in death but remained cherished in her heart.

She lived in the US for over thirty years and enjoyed travels to England and Germany with her family. Her faith, cultivated in the church, was her guiding light. Her spiritual journey started in the Pentecostal church where her grandfather was a minister. Later becoming a Methodist she attended Methodist churches wherever she lived.

In her final years, she was lovingly cared for at a nursing home, where she formed close bonds with her caregiver Maria and her favorite nurse, Marguerita, who helped to ensure her last days were peaceful and dignified.

Charisma Pre-School who leased the Education Buildings has begun the facility upgrades that are part of their new lease. The new HVAC system has been installed and the copper re-piping of the building is in process. The water to both the Education Building and the Yellow House is now

supplied through copper pipe eliminating any galvanized piping which for years has added to a rust problem in the freshwater system. It's very exciting to see these buildings get the needed repairs that have been put off for years.

We continue to work on a real estate listing agreement as we look for additional Fellowship Hall user groups.
