Heart to Heart

As the leaves begin to turn and the air grows crisp, we're reminded that fall is a season of both gratitude and reflection. It's that special time when we take a deep breath, look back at how God has guided us through the year, and look ahead to how we can live faithfully in the months to come.

This October and November, we'll enter our Stewardship Season, guided by the theme: "Stewardship as a Lifestyle."

It's a reminder that stewardship isn't just a campaign or a Sunday pledge — it's a way of life.

In 1 Timothy 6:17 -19, Paul writes,

"Command those who are rich in this present world not to be arrogant nor to put their hope in wealth... but to put their hope in God, who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment. Command them to do good, to be rich in good deeds, and to be generous and willing to share."

Paul's words challenge us to see stewardship not as a duty, but as a daily rhythm of gratitude and generosity. It's about placing our trust—not in what we have—but in the God who provides. It's about using what's been placed in our hands to do good, bless others, and invest in what truly lasts.

Throughout October, our worship will focus on three simple invitations:

- 1. Trusting the Giver more than the gift.
- 2. Rich in Good Deeds Seeing generosity as a lifestyle, not a moment.
- 3. The Life That Is Truly Life Discovering joy and meaning through open-handed living.

We'll also be introducing The Basket Challenge 2026, a yearlong invitation to live out stewardship through small, creative monthly acts of faith, kindness, and giving. It's simple, tangible, and deeply spiritual—a way for every household to experience the joy of giving in everyday life.

This fall, I invite you to pause and pray:

"Lord, how can I live more generously?

How can I trust You more fully with what I have?"

May this season be one where we rediscover the beauty of a grateful heart—where giving is not about obligation but about joy, not about scarcity but about abundance, and not about numbers but about love.

With gratitude for each of you, and with hope for what God will do among us.

Administrative Committee Reports

Financial Update

As noted in the August Courier, we had a fraudulent \$8000 check go through our bank account. Since we identified it quickly, it was reimbursed by Bank of America. We have opened a new account and are in the process of changing our signers so that the compromised signature can't be used again. In addition, we've changed to a more secure type of check that is harder to manipulate. We'll keep our fingers crossed that this is the end of it! Many thanks to Margaret Cates for her work with the bank and others to improve the security of our bank account.

Facility Update

We still have a few major projects that won't be addressed until later this year. They are spot painting of an assortment of areas on the inside and outside of the buildings and treating the termites behind the monitors in the sanctuary. We have continued to have problems with our electrical sockets near the entrance of the Fellowship Hall attracting homeless who use them to charge their phones. It's becoming a larger problem, and the Pre-School has lost some new student signups because of the problem. Roger Johnson has come to the rescue and found breaker switches that turn off the outside Fellowship Hall receptacles.

User Group Update

We are sad to report that the San Fernando Youth Chorus has decided to leave our campus. They have been with us for many years, and we wish them all the best in their new practice facility! The Boy Scout troop was disbanded earlier this year, and we hope to have Youth Room 2 (previously the Puppet Room) clean for future use by the end of summer. The Assessor's office sent out an auditor to work with Charisma Pre-School about the amount of property taxes they will be liable for. We're glad to report the amount will be less than previously determined.

Upcoming Advent Project

Between November 2nd – November 30th, First United Methodist Church of Canoga Park will be collecting monetary donations or \$25 Walmart gift cards as our Advent Project for the two Hope the Mission shelters located in Chatsworth.

Congregants may purchase as many gift cards as they choose but we ask that each gift card does not exceed \$25. These will be distributed to the families the weekend of December 6th so parents can purchase Christmas gifts, clothes, shoes, etc. for their children.

The family shelter houses 48 residents (parents and children) and the T.A.Y (Transitional Aged Youth; ages 18-24) houses 38 youth. Residents are provided three meals per day, enrollment into schools for the children by LAUSD as well as mental health services and clothes, if needed. The T.A.Y. youth must either attend school or have a job to qualify for residence.

The Stronghold of the Chosen An Interactive Bible Study

The Chosen is a multi-season video drama, Bible interpretive discussion series. Classes will be conducted for nine Sundays beginning on September 21 in the Library following the fellowship time. Please register using the signup sheet on the bulletin board in the parlor, talking with Roger Johnson or with the church office.

The Chosen, Season 5 invites you into the tumultuous final days of Jesus' earthly ministry – what's become known as Holy Week. Beginning with His triumphant entry into Jerusalem astride a donkey's colt, the story covers a side of Jesus we haven't seen before beginning with His righteous rage at the moneychangers and the Sanhedrin in the temple.

This season's study is for people who want to find a safe place in Jesus. The Stronghold of the Chosen video drama helps us see Jesus, through the eyes of His followers, as the stronghold we want and need in our lives.

What is a stronghold? Well, a stronghold is a place. It's a place of safety, fortified to protect inhabitants against attack. It's a place where people (like us) can feel secure, surrounded by high, sturdy walls. It's a place to be restored and rest. It's a place to plan the way forward.

In The Stronghold of the Chosen study, we'll learn that Jesus is our safe place, along with all the reasons we should run to and remain in Him when hard times come and also when it is time to celebrate.

Join us as we see the events of the Holy Week through the eyes of His followers and understand more deeply how people responded to Him then and how we can respond to Him now.


Stewardship as a Lifestyle
