New CEO

Candle of Commitment

This represents the cost of our Mission work to women, children and youth in the U.S. and countries around the world. The candle will burn at the Conference Annual Meeting on October 21, 2023 as a way of honoring "The Mission-Minded Men and Women in our Lives." The candle will burn for one minutes for a minimum gift of \$16.56 per honoree. Names must be submitted by October 1.

New resources for 2024 will be available in September.

United Women in Faith along with the Global Ministries of the United Methodist Church joined with several interfaith communities to co-sponsor a Briefing with the U.S. Department of Energy on July 18, 2023.

The session was led by the Rev. Susan Hendershot, president of Interfaith Power and Light, a national non-profit that mobilizes people of faith to take action on climate change.

The session began with a presentation by Sec. of U.S. Dept. of Energy, Jennifer Granholm, who highlighted congregations of different faiths that are making changes to reduce their carbon footprint. Because of the Inflation Reduction Act, non-taxable entities can now get tax credits on energy upgrades for HVAC systems, lighting and windows.

Ms. Granholm said faith communities are uniquely positioned to get the word out about the tools we have to support clean energy. This is a moral mandate that benefits all people.

Financial Update

The June quarterly financials were completed promptly, and we are starting to get a clearer picture of where we stand. Over the first half of 2023, our financials show that we are close to a breakeven, so that's the good news. In addition, we'll start saving insurance and utility costs the church was paying for the preschool before its closure. This will drop our costs by about \$7500/year, and we are in the process of cleaning the preschool rooms and looking for a tenant. When we find one, it will mean about \$25,000/year in new income. All of this means we're continuing to move in the right direction. We just need time!

Even though our finances are stabilizing we have a large, unexpected item that needs repair, and which is not in our budget, so we have decided to run an Appeal. The unexpected expense is to replace the main gas lines to the sanctuary that were leaking. The gas has been shut off for about 30 days, which is fine for the summer, but we'll need heat for the winter. We've gone through a quoting process with five different plumbing companies and the lowest quote is around \$15k. This \$15,000 is the first part of our Appeal, which is urgent.

During Covid we spent about 38k of our designated monies for budget items – weakening our overall financial position. The second part of the Appeal is to find a few people in the congregation who might be able to give in a major way to get us back closer to our pre-covid financial position. If we can raise more than the \$15k needed for the gas re-piping it will go to making up the Covid financial deficits and give us financial breathing room for any future emergencies with our aging facilities!

Appeal: Our Goal

\$15,000: Gas Re-Pipe - It's critical that we raise this money

\$35,000: Covid Financial Deficits - Anyone contemplating large gifts – this is the time we need it!

It's a big number but we all must dig deep and do our best. It's a time to give back in response to God's Love! We thank you in advance!!!

Facilities Update Landscaping:

We continued to be plagued with irrigation system problems. The evening of July 4th one of our user groups reported the sprinklers had been on for hours near the sanctuary double doors. A difficult time to get people out to repair when fireworks events are happening, but we were lucky to get Jose Juarez, our gardener, out to identify the problem as a broken sprinkler valve and he was able to manually shut off the system. We are attempting to get money back from the DWP for this event and the main water line leak a month ago.

Our new Succulent Garden just outside the Narthex is having a bit of a hard time with the high heat but the plants should survive, and the roots set by next summer. Our gardener is going to move one of the large rocks in the area which will complete the project.

Gophers are back! We spotted some holes under the large tree by the Preschool Office. We'll be after them soon.

Maintenance:

The natural gas is still off to the Sanctuary and Education buildings due to a leak discovered last month. We expect to have the project completed in August. It most likely will be re-piped over the roof from the outside of the choir room, up over the roof, and down to the two main entry points on the Maynard side of the building. We had 5 plumbers quoting and we were pleased to get some very competitive but still expensive quotes!

User Groups:

We're glad to say that all user groups are current with their user fees/rents. We've had one new enquiry from a Bonsai Club. Thanks to Michael Mosbe for the referral. If any of you know a non-profit organization that needs space, please tell them about First UMC of CP!!
