Heart to Heart

On Sunday, October 15th, I delivered a sermon titled "Why Are We Here?" based on Judges 21 and Hebrews 8:10-11. My emotions were raw as I grappled with the ongoing conflict between Israel and the terrorist organization Hamas.

Much like the tumultuous times of the Judges, our present era is marked by division, self-interest, and a "me-first" mentality. It's a world where everyone believes they're right, and those who disagree are wrong. This atmosphere makes it all too familiar to see people doing "what seems to be right in their own eyes." But life has rules, and so does God. We desperately need order.

The reason we are here, I emphasized, is to treat one another with equality, to halt the violence, to transform the world's ways, and to align ourselves with what is right in the eyes of God. We must prioritize God's ways over our own, yielding to His guidance and letting His rules bring order to people's lives.

We are not here to engage in conflict, to commit violence, to steal, to cheat, to abuse, or to judge one another.

I concluded with a prayer from Howard Thurman that still echoes in my mind, reinforcing the message of why we are here:

Open unto me, light for my darkness.
Open unto me, courage for my fear.
Open unto me, hope for my despair.
Open unto me, peace for my turmoil.
Open unto me, joy for my sorrow.
Open unto me, strength for my weakness.
Open unto me, wisdom for my confusion.
Open unto me, forgiveness for my sins.
Open unto me, tenderness for my toughness.
Open unto me, love for my hates.
Open unto me, Thy Self for myself.
Lord, Lord, open unto me!

May this prayer serve as a constant reminder of our purpose and the values we should uphold in our lives.

Canoga Park First UMW 50th Anniversary Celebration

Recently Canoga Park First UMW/UWF celebrated their 50th anniversary. Shirley Thomson spoke on "UMW – Who are we?" United Methodist Women DBA United Women in Faith is the country's largest denominational faith organization for women in the world.



The Canoga Park First United Methodist Women's Unit received its charter in 1973. There were 174 Charter Members. Two Charter Members – Glynene Roe and Mary Mackay – were in the congregation on September 24th. There are a few other Charter Members in Assisted Living Facilities.

Our Unit has three Circles that meet monthly. There are two Circles that meet during the day. **Bookends** reviews and discusses books drawn from biography, fiction, Spiritual Growth and the classics; **Sarah** Circle meets for breakfast at Weilers Deli on Sherman Way. Emphasis is on fellowship, concern for church members and development of supportive relationships among the members. **Faith, Hope and Love** meets at night in the Library where the hostess presents a program in an area of interest. In addition there are **Members at Large** who have not designated a circle to which they wish to belong.

Frequently Asked Questions on United Women in Faith (continued from last month)

Can we remain members, stay connected and join another local unit if our church leaves The United Methodist Church?

Yes. United Methodist Church membership has never been required for United Methodist Women membership. Bylaws changes allow for women to be involved and be leaders in our organization even if they become affiliated with another denomination. Our new name captures this inclusivity.

What do these changes have to do with "new wineskins?

United Methodist Women – now United Women in Faith – is again saying yes to being part of what God is doing in the 21st Century by creating new ways for women today to gather for faith, sisterhood and action for women, children, and youth.

In other words, we are making new wine and new wineskins to fulfill our role in God's mission today. We tap Jesus' use of the metaphor in Mark 2:22 to explain the need for change to help us share with members the new tools, programs, and exciting changes on the horizon for our organization.

Upcoming Advent Project

for Hope the Mission Family Shelter

Hope the Mission's family shelter, in Woodland Hills, opened in May 2023. Currently, there are 275 children and 125 adults (75% single mothers, 15% single fathers, 10% 2 parent families) in the 100 unit, 400 bed facility. Each room has two bunk beds (four beds per room). Each room comes with a microwave, mini-fridge and bathroom and residents are provided three meals per day as well as mental health services if needed.

Between December 3-December 17, First United Methodist Church of Canoga Park will be collecting money or gift cards as our Advent Project.

Congregants may purchase as many gift cards as they choose, but we ask that each gift card not exceed \$25. These will be distributed to the families living at Hope the Mission, so they can purchase Christmas gifts, clothes, shoes, etc. for their children.

Stewardship

The theme this year is **A Grateful Heart**.

"Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace...." 1 Peter 4:10

We believe that everything we have comes from a God who loves us. Stewardship is no more and no less than responding to God's love with a grateful heart for all that we have been given. Your generous giving to this church means that in our corner here in the West San Fernando Valley, sick people are

not forgotten, the bereaved find hope, and young people receive scholarships. Your support also bolsters ministries around the world benefitting refugees and other people needing help, as everything the larger church does is also done by you.

The campaign began in mid-October and will conclude with these three Sundays: Inspiration Sunday will be October 29, when Stewardship packets will be available. Gratitude Sunday will be November 12. Celebration Sunday will be November 19.



Financial Update

Appeal: The appeal was a huge success! After preparing the 9-month financial statements we found additional appeal monies that were misclassified as loose plate.

The new grand total is \$37,000. With this money we were able to pay for the gas repiping, get this year's budget on track, and limit the amount of designated fund write-offs. The original \$37,000 in designated funds which we used during Covid was reduced to \$19,000 and written off. We now have money behind all fund balances. Most importantly we have protected the Capital Fund's \$23,000 which is the fund that we use for facility repairs over \$2,500. We're now in a markedly improved financial condition and we thank everyone for your contributions!

Facilities Update

The gas repipe is done. Relighting pilot lights has been a struggle, but we got them working and the gas is on. We have one more fix to the floor under the gas heater that the gas company tagged us for. That is in progress and will be done by the end of October. The flea abatement behind the Education Building cost \$1,700 which included closing off 6 openings under the Yellow House. All in all, a good quote and the service went smoothly. The sanctuary hall and women's bathroom walls were re-plastered since we did not see any additional water leaks from Hurricane Hilary's summer rainfall. We will complete the painting of the patched walls in the next 90 days. Before year's end, we'll have the roofs and rain gutters cleaned in preparation for the winter rains. In preparation for the October 21st RockChippers, Rock & Mineral retail show we fixed a couple of sprinklers that could have been liability issues.

The request for a credit from the LADWP regarding the two major water leaks we had this summer has been resubmitted, but it has turned complicated and we're not sure we will have the proper backup that is required. Hopefully, we will get some good news on this front!

We are also quoting two large projects that will be done in conjunction with any new renters of the Education Buildings. The two projects are replacement of the main water line to that building and then re-piping the building water lines. The 50+ year old piping was done in galvanized pipe which is now corroded, with rusty water and leaking pipes. We will keep you posted.

User Groups

The Boy Scouts are slowly progressing with the move to Youth Room 2 – the old Puppet Room. We plan to offer their original room on an exclusive basis to new user groups. We have two separate real estate agents helping us look for new user groups. We've had 5 preschool tours and four tours of the Fellowship Hall with churches interested in renting space for their religious services. No offers yet, but we expect something by year's end. The Assistance League who already rent two Education Building rooms and the FH office will now be holding their monthly meeting on the last Wednesday of the month in the FH Gym.
